

As a shared space, the Hub can focus on being as energy efficient as possible to bring down all members overhead costs.





We sowed seeds, pulled up weeds, spread mulch, and filled garden beds for future crops of herbs and veggies.








Community Based : Kualoa Ranch Program 9 49-560 Kam. Hwy, Kaneohe, Hl

Hub Dojo centers around a guest speaker sharing their expertise on their respective field and a shared lunch.




This is our members' opportunity to step away from work and meet fellow members in a casual setting. Sharing meals has also contributed to our communities social and emotional wellbeing.

Back Together Fund

In 2022, Hub Coworking Hawai'i announced its Back Together Fund to help revive the local economy and help local businesses and business people.

The \$200,000 in-kind fund, helped to support and enable people to gather again for face-to-face events, meetings, and collaborations.





HTY (Honolulu Theatre for Youth) is committed to educating young people and and families about sustainability and to telling the stories of our diverse island community. The HI Way television show is created by a team of Native Hawaiian and BIPOC artists. Emmy award winning and nominated episodes included topics like Food Waste, Anti-Asian Hate, Pono, Energy in Hawai'i and other topics relevant to Hawai'i.

The show's title the HI Way is a short for the "Hawai'i" Way. The episode that premiered at the Hub was funded by a grant from the State Department of Health as an initiative around Health Equity. The goal of the episode was to help foster healthy habits for all families.

Back-Together Fund W-rite

Our Back Together Fund helped to support organizations like W-rite.

W-rite is a group of Educators from Hawai'i independent, HIDOE & public charter schools that meet on the last Wednesday of each month to focus on writing presentations, portfolios, applications, newsletters, poems, articles, lessons, websites, memos, resources, applications, letters of recommendations, nominations, grants, National Board certification entries, curriculum, books and so much more.



Back-Together Fund National Novel Writing Month

Veronica Vera is a Sci-Fi Author and Hub Member. Veronica applied for our Back Together Fund in hopes of hosting her own NaNoWriMo weekly sessions at the Hub.

NaNoWriMo is a not-for-profit organisation offering structure, community, and encouragement to writers who want to develop a consistent writing habit. Writing a novel alone can be isolating, the online forum allows writers from diverse backgrounds to offer encouragement, updates and advice to each other. Every day you set aside time to write with the aim of hitting 50,000 words by the end of November.

Veronica opened up this opportunity to not only authors/novelists but anyone with a writing project that needed accountability and community to make strides on their respective projects.





Outside of her duties as the Community Coordinator here at the Hub, Anette Arinix produces comedy shows. Her hopes is to use comedy as the medium to highlight and bring representation to her community.

Polynesian AF is a sketch comedy variety show that launched in 2021 and is sister to the LA-based, Asian AF.

In the first year, most of their rehearsals had to be done online. This time, with sponsorship from the Back-Together Fund, Polynesian AF was able to meet and rehearse in person for their upcoming shows in October 2022.
